



Sheep Prayers


perspective, being left behind in the field and missing out on seeing Jesus. I wonder who are the people who are missing this Christmas?

Out out some sheep shapes from paper or card. Think about the people who you feel are missing out, who are the people who are feeling forgotten? Refugees, the



What you do


Make lots of different sheep: they can be drawn, collaged, made from playdough or Lego or however you want to make them.

Some collaging materials to create animal faces Some ribbon or elastic to hold the masks in place


What you do
