

If you have a Bible, see if you can find the story in there.

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
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



This story reminds us that we only ever see a glimpse of our amazing world, there is a lot we never see. Choose one part of creation and take a deep dive into it. Find out all you can




What's in the box?

God is all around in everything that we can see, hear, smell and touch.


Say Thank you for all the things that you notice big and small.





Weather Chart You will need:

What you do:

Create some weather symbols.

On a circle, divide it into segments and put weather symbols in each segment and cut out an arrow from small card. Join the arrow to the circle using a split pin.




Or create The weather today chart.
